Veterinary Technology

Care for animals in a rewarding medical career



SJVC's Veterinary Technology (VT) program prepares students with the skills to help animals when they need it most. This in-depth training covers animal patient care including lab tests, radiology procedures and surgical assisting. Curriculum also focuses on communication skills involving pet owner education, sick animal counseling and wellness/preventative measures.

Students Learn

- · Animal nursing fundamentals
- Laboratory procedures
- Diagnostic imaging
- Veterinary office practices
- Large animal handling

Students receive 1,000 hours of hands-on training under the direct supervision of an RVT or DVM. Externship rotations include various animal care environments to give students real-world experience.

Professional Certifications

Graduates earn an Associate of Science degree and are immediately eligible to work as a Veterinary Assistant. SJVC Fresno's Veterinary Technology program holds initial accreditation by the American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA), qualifying students to sit for both the California Veterinary Technician Examination (CVTE) and the Veterinary Technician National Exam (VTNE) right after graduating. Upon successful completion of both exams, graduates are eligible to obtain state licensure and work as a Registered Veterinary Technician (RVT). Career Information

Veterinary assistants are qualified to provide support to a veterinarian in the treatment of animals. Graduates are also qualified to work in animal shelters, zoos, and research facilities and prepared to perform the following job duties:

- · Monitor animals under anesthesia
- Perform radiology procedures
- Assist in surgical procedures
- Bathe, comfort & feed sick animals
- Perform laboratory tests

Admission Requirements

Admission to the VT program requires:

- High school diploma or equivalent
- Wonderlic SLE assessment score of 15 or higher

Applicants must have reliable plans for transportation, child care and time to devote to academic work outside of scheduled class hours.
