## Credential and **Professional Certifications**

Graduates earn an Associate of Science degree and are eligible to sit for the National Council Licensure Examination for Practical Nurses (NCLEX-PN). This exam requires a background check. Graduates also earn HIPAA certification.

#### **State Licensure**

Graduates who pass the NCLEX-PN are licensed by the Board of Vocational Nursing and are authorized to the use the credential Licensed Vocational Nurse (LVN), which is a requirement to work in this field.

The Vocational Nursing program content and hours are approved by the Board of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians.

LVNs can work in nursing and residential care facilities, hospitals, physicians' offices, and home healthcare services\*\*. These health professionals typically perform the following job duties:\*\*\*

- Administer prescribed medications and start intravenous
- Observe patients, charting and reporting changes in patients' conditions
- Assemble and use equipment, such as catheters, tracheotomy tubes, and oxygen suppliers
- Collect samples, such as blood, urine, and sputum from
- Prepare patients for examinations, tests, treatments, and explain procedures
- Set up equipment and prepare medical treatment rooms
- Inventory and requisition supplies and instruments
- Assist in delivery, care, or feeding of infants
