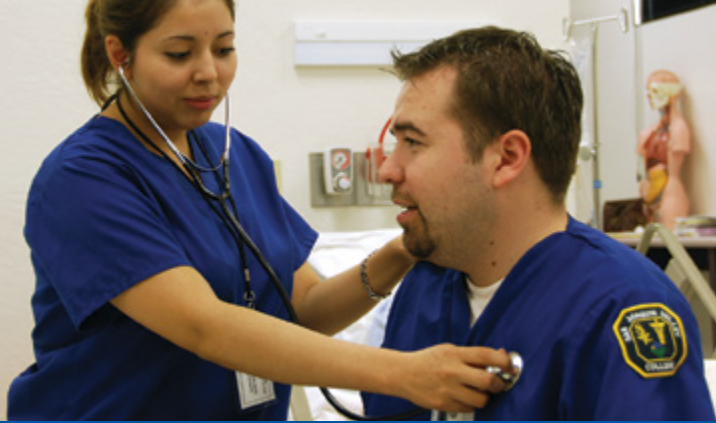
SJVC's Licensed Vocational Nursing (LVN) program trains you to have the skills to offer professional care to the sick, injured, convalescent and disabled under the direction of physicians and registered nurses.

LVNs are an important part of a health care team responsible for administering nursing care, detecting illnesses, and patient education.

The program includes a clinical rotation which allows students to further their studies in a real-world medical environment. This hands-on clinical training enhances the learning experience and allows students to develop a work history while completing their studies.

Hands-On Training

Students Learn:

- Patient care and nursing fundamentals
- Medical/Surgical concepts
- Healthcare ethics
- Laboratory skills
- Administrative practices



Professional Certifications

Graduates earn an Associate of Science degree and are eligible to take the State Board of Vocational Nursing licensing examination. Graduates also earn Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) Certification.

San Joaquin Valley College's Licensed Vocational Nursing program is accredited by the Board of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians.

Students who are being enrolled in the LVN program must provide proof prior to the start date of current CPR certification. The card must be from the American Heart Association and be current through the entire program.



Career Information

LVNs can work in hospitals, medical offices, clinics, and correctional facilities. These health professionals perform the following job duties:

- Administer prescribed medications and start intravenous fluids
- Observe patients, charting and reporting changes in patients' conditions
- Evaluate nursing intervention outcomes, conferring with other healthcare team members
- Assemble and use equipment, such as catheters, tracheotomy tubes, and oxygen suppliers
- Collect samples, such as blood, urine, and sputum from patients
- Prepare patients for examinations, tests, treatments, and explain procedures
- Set up equipment and prepare medical treatment rooms
- Inventory and requisition supplies and instruments
- Assist in delivery, care, or feeding of infants

Admissions Requirements

- High school diploma or equivalent
- Applicant must be in good health and physically fit
- Applicant must be age 18 by his/her expected start date

Applicants to the LVN program are selected based on points earned in an evaluation process that includes assessment, transcript review, and personal interview. Applicants must have reliable plans for transportation, child care and time to devote to academic work outside of scheduled class hours.
