Hands-On Training

Students Learn:

- Computerized dental management/charting software
- Interim Therapeutic Restoration (ITR) placement
- Intra-Oral cameras
- Digital and traditional x-ray techniques
- Hand and ultrasonic instruments for advanced scaling and root planing methods



Credential and Professional Certifications

Graduates earn an Associate of Science Degree and are eligible to take the National Board written examination and a State and/or Regional Board Examination for licensure as a Registered Dental Hygienist. SJVC prepares students to take appropriate certification and licensure exams related to their individual majors. The College does not guarantee students will successfully pass these exams or be certified or licensed as a result of completing the program.

The program in Dental Hygiene is accredited by the Commission On Dental Accreditation. The Commission is a specialized accrediting body recognized by the United States Department of Education. State Licensure

Each state has specific clinical examination requirements for licensure as a dental hygienist. The state of California accepts any one of the following clinical examinations: Western Regional Examining Board (WREB) dental hygiene examination, Central Regional Dental Testing Service (CRDTS) dental hygiene examination, or California RDH clinical examination.

Graduates are eligible to sit for the California RDH clinical examination after they have passed the National Board Dental Hygiene Examination. Graduating seniors may take the WREB or CRDTS examination during their final semester, with certification from the Academic Dean or Dental Hygiene Program Director.

Clinical Hours

Students in the dental hygiene program experience an increasing number of clinical hours as they progress through the program in order to obtain clinical competence. First year dental hygiene students participate in 120 hours of preclinical training during their first term, followed by 136 hours of clinical experience during their second term. During the second academic year, terms 3 and 4, students are scheduled for 204 and 240 hours per term, respectively.

Career Opportunities

Graduates are prepared to work in private dental offices, public health agencies, or clinics. These skilled professionals prerequisite are expected to perform the following job duties:

- Evaluate medical and dental health histories
- Provide periodontal therapy through stain, plaque and calculus removal
- Expose and process dental x-rays
- Place interim therapeutic restorations, dental sealants, fluoride, varnish and tooth desensitizing agents

Admissions Requirements

The following prerequisite courses must be completed at an accredited college or university recognized by the US Dept. of Education with an overall GPA of 2.75 or higher:

General/Inorganic Chemistry (with lab) General Microbiology (with lab)(BIOL 14)* Human Physiology (with lab) Speech/ Oral Communication Introduction to Sociology Organic/Biochemistry (with lab)(CHE 4)* Human Anatomy (with lab) Writing and Composition General Psychology Intermediate Algebra or higher (not included in the minimum GPA requirements for entry into the program)



*Science courses must have been completed within the past seven (7) years. The BIOL 14 and/or CHE 4 course(s) may be offered to applicants who have successfully completed all other prerequisite courses.

**If Anatomy and Physiology are taken as a combined course (i.e., A&P 1, A&P 2), both courses must be taken at the same institution.

Applicants must have reliable plans for transportation, child care and time to devote to school work outside of scheduled class hours.
