Professional Certifications

Graduates earn an Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) and are eligible to apply to the California Board of Registered Nursing to sit for the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nursing (NCLEX-RN), a requirement for practice as a registered nurse.

San Joaquin Valley College's RN program is approved by the California Board of Registered Nursing (BRN).

Career Information

Registered nurses work in hospitals, private practices, clinics, and home care agencies, and perform the following job duties:

- Administer medication and treatment to patients
- Manage and assign tasks to the health care team
- Perform routine laboratory work
- Assist physicians in exams and surgeries

Admission Requirements

Applicants must have a high school diploma or GED and have completed the necessary prerequisite courses* with a GPA of 2.5 or higher at a college or university accredited by an accrediting agency recognized by the US Dept. of Education:

Writing and Composition Intermediate Algebra General Chemistry with lab Intro to Public Speaking Human Anatomy with lab *See application for more information

Intro to Sociology Microbiology with lab Human Physiology with lab General Psychology Humanities*

Applicants must also have current BLS certification from the American Heart Association.

Applicants must have reliable plans for transportation, child care and time to devote to academic work outside of scheduled class hours.

Application Process

The application process for the RN Program is highly selective. The most qualified applicants meeting the prerequisites and minimum requirements will be selected using points earned from:

- ATI TEAS assessments, to be administered during the application process
- Postsecondary education (Attainment, GPA)
- Personal essay
- Application selection interview

A one page written personal statement explaining why the applicant wants to become a registered nurse (to be done during the applicant selection interview).

Qualified candidates will be considered for invitation to interview with the selection committee.

Academic Information

The curriculum is offered in four 20-week terms. Classes are scheduled Tuesday and Thursday for lectures and lab courses, and one clinical day per week (hours may vary). SJVC provides 2 instructors for every 12 students in a clinical rotation.

Classes for this program are offered Tuesday and Thursday.
