Graduation Rates

The graduation rate of first-time, full-time students who started between the timeframe of September 1, 2014 through August 31, 2015 and completed their program of study within 150% of the normal projected timeframe is 54%. The table below provides the graduation rates by gender, ethnicity, and receipt/non-receipt of Federal student financial aid.

Retention Rates

The retention rate of first-time, full-time students who began their program of study in Fall 2019 (August 1, 2019 – October 31, 2019) and are still enrolled or who have completed their studies as of the end of Fall 2020 (October 31, 2020) year is 71%. The retention rates for first-time, full-time students for the Fall 2019 cohort by campus are provided in the table below. The institutional and campus retention rates were calculated using the IPEDS formula. If a campus does not appear in the list below then there were no first-time, full-time entering students in Fall 2019.
