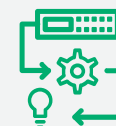

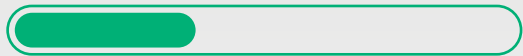

Our History

San Joaquin Valley College (SJVC) and Carrington College have long shared a mission of empowering students through career-focused education, a commitment that deepened when they came together under San Joaquin Valley College, Inc. (SJVCi). Today, these two institutions stand as pillars of opportunity, helping students develop the skills they need to succeed while making a lasting impact on the communities they serve.

SJVC's story began in 1977 when founders Shirley and Bob Perry recognized a need for high-quality, local career training. Shirley, who had taught herself medical assisting while raising a family, understood firsthand the barriers to education. Determined to improve educational opportunities for others, the Perrys opened the first SJVC campus in Visalia, California, with just three students in its Medical Assisting class. Over time, SJVC grew into an accredited, multi-campus institution offering a range of accelerated Certificate, Associate, and Bachelor of Science degree programs. Through its outcome-based learning approach, SJVC has continued to shape the workforce by preparing highly skilled, motivated graduates for in-demand careers.

Carrington College has a similarly rich history, having provided hands-on career training since 1967. In 2018, the Perrys and SJVCi acquired Carrington College, expanding their family-run educational enterprise across multiple states and more than doubling the number of students pursuing careers in nursing and allied health. The partnership was a natural fit, as both colleges shared a deep commitment to student success and quality career education. Collectively, SJVC and Carrington College have more than 100 years of career college experience.

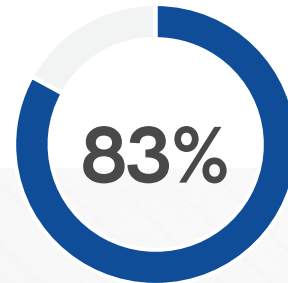

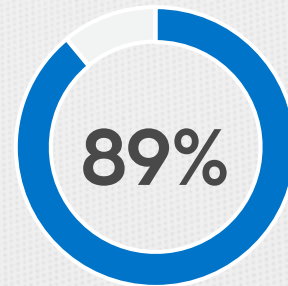

SJVC and Carrington College prepare future nurses through hands-on, industry-aligned education. Our Vocational Nursing (VN) and Practical Nursing (PN) programs train students to provide professional care under the guidance of physicians and registered nurses. Licensed Vocational Nurses (LVNs) play a vital role in healthcare teams, administering treatments, assisting in diagnoses, and educating patients. With programs in California, Idaho, and New Mexico, we help meet the growing demand for skilled nurses.

Training covers medical-surgical, geriatric, pediatric, obstetric, neonatal, and mental health nursing. 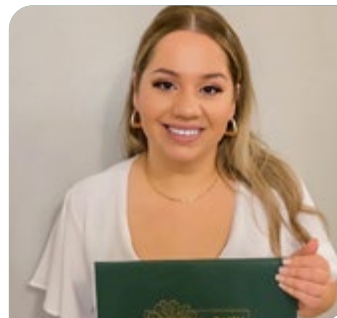

Access to education should never be limited by financial barriers. Our Financial Aid teams actively guide students through the process, helping them secure additional opportunities.

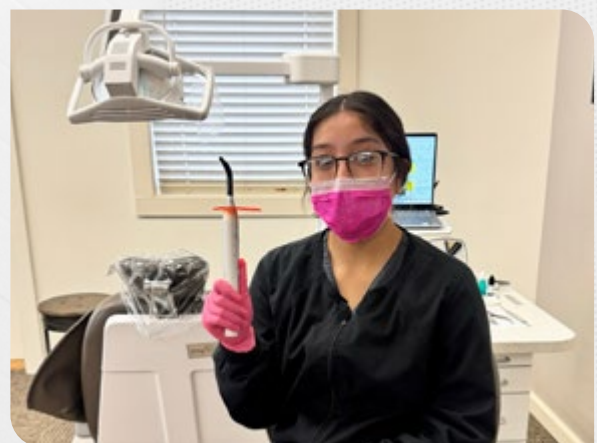
The **Irving Wohl Memorial Scholarship** continues to support dental hygiene students at Carrington College, honoring a WWII veteran's legacy.

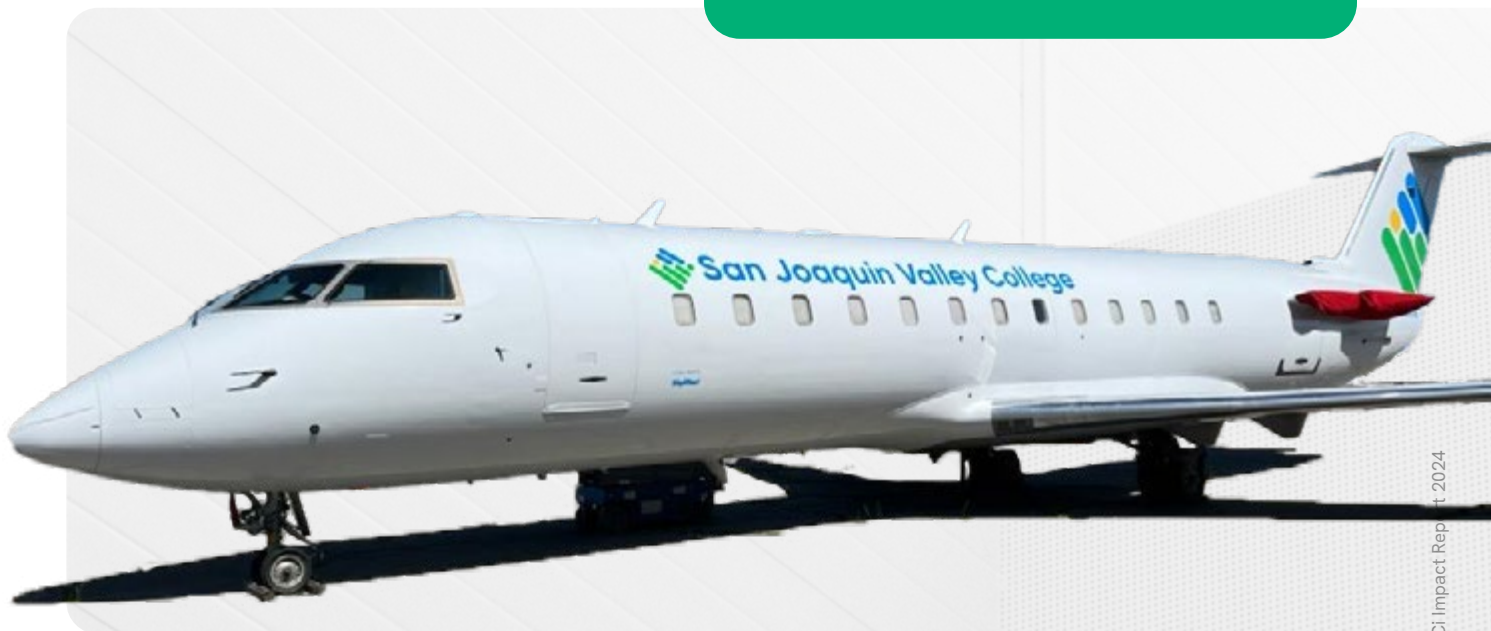

Last year, our collaboration reached new heights when Renown Health's Chief Nurse Executive, Melodie Osborn, joined members of Carrington College's nursing programs at Capitol Hill Day in Washington, D.C. During Hill Day, Osborn saw firsthand how deeply Carrington College is committed to its students, and how our shared efforts can drive real change.
