- o \*Traditional campus students who have transferred in a minimum of 24 college level credits and have a 3.0 GPA or higher can waive the University Foundations course, UNV-303.
- o Students who complete a transfer-oriented associate degree (Associate of Arts or Associate of Science) may fulfill Grand Canyon University's General Education requirements. See GCU University Policy Handbook or speak to a GCU enrollment counselor for more details.
- O Students may transfer a maximum of 90 semester credit hours, no more than 84 credits of which can be lower-division.
- o Students must earn and/or transfer a minimum of 36 semester credits in upper division (300 or above) courses.
- o Students must earn and/or transfer a minimum of 120 semester credits in order to earn a Bachelor degree.
- o All Grand Canyon University programs follow a Program of Study, which can be changed by the University at any time. All Programs of Study are subject to the terms, conditions, and policies outlined in the University's enrollment application and the

University Policy Handbook.
