Criminal Justice: Corrections



SJVC's Criminal Justice: Corrections (CJC) program stretches beyond the minimum training required by law with an in depth combination of classroom instruction and hands-on experience. Coursework includes criminal law, evidence collection and preservation, report writing and criminal procedures.

Students Learn

- Arrest/control techniques
- Firearms use
- Weaponless defense tactics
- CPR & first aid

Professional Certifications

Graduates earn an Associate of Science degree. They also earn STC Certification with an option for Baton Certification when they complete the Adult Corrections Officer Core Course. Graduates may also earn PC 832 Laws of Arrest/Firearms Certification (POST).

The Adult Corrections Officer Core Course (15-week STC Academy, CJ60-A) of the Criminal Justice: Corrections program is approved by the Corrections Standards Authority (California Board of Corrections)

Career Information

Jails and correctional facilities rely on corrections officers to perform these important tasks:

- · Oversee inmates in a jail or correctional facility
- Transport inmates or detainees
- Supervise inmate work detail
- Search and seizure

Admission Requirements

Admission to the CJC program requires:

- · High school diploma or equivalent
- Wonderlic SLE assessment score of 12 or higher
- U.S. Citizenship
- No felony criminal convictions
- No misdemeanor convictions that would prohibit applicant from possessing a firearm
- · No legal conditions that would prohibit applicant from possessing a firearm
- · Valid California driver license
- · Applicant must be in good health and physically fit
- Applicant must be age 18 by his/her program start date

Applicants must have reliable plans for transportation, child care and time to devote to academic work outside of scheduled class hours.
