Pharmacy Technology





SJVC's Pharmacy Technology (PhT) program prepares students to work under the direct supervision of a Registered Pharmacist as part of a team responsible for carrying out a doctor's pharmaceutical orders. Pharmacy Technicians assist in the various activities of compounding, distributing and dispensing of medications.

Students Learn

- Prescription processing
- Computer data entry
- · Pharmacy law & ethics
- Clinical applications

Training includes a balance of classroom and lab instruction, as well as an externship component, which allows students experiential learning in an actual clinical environment

Professional Certifications

Graduates earn a Certificate of Completion or Associate of Science degree, are qualified to register with the State Board of Pharmacy to become a licensed Pharmacy Technician, and are eligible to take the National Pharmacy Technician Certification Board exam to become a Certified Pharmacy Technician (CPhT). Graduates also earn Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) Certification.

Career Information

A well-trained pharmacy technician can expect to work in a professional environment as an integral part of a health care team. These skilled technicians are expected to perform the following job duties:

- Process prescriptions
- Prepare I.V.s
- Compound creams, ointments and medication
- · Operate pharmacy software
- Maintain inventory control

Admission Requirements

Admission to the PhT program requires:

- High school diploma or equivalent
- Wonderlic SLE assessment score of 12 or higher

Applicants must have reliable plans for transportation, child care and time to devote to academic work outside of scheduled class hours.
