#### **RECOMMENTATION FOR PROGRAM EXPANSION AT SJVC SAN DIEGO CAMPUS: Medical Assisting and Administrative Health Care Management**

- There are over 130,000 adults in the 18 to 24 year age range who do not have an Associate of Science Degree
  - Four Community Colleges in the San Diego County are currently accommodating 75,000 students
  - SJVC has an opportunity to contribute to the career education for the 18 to 24 age demographic
- There are over 6,000 high school seniors who will add to the 18 to 24 year age range who will be seeking higher education and/or career training each year
- SJVC maintains a successful record of training students as well as positive employer satisfaction in the Medical Assisting and Medical Office career fields

San Joaquin Valley College (SJVC) San Diego Campus is currently designed to accommodate a Dental Hygiene (DH) Program that results in an Associate of Science Degree (AS). The DH Program is appropriate for a narrow career field. Expanding the program offerings at the campus provide additional career education opportunities for those seeking career educations and will result in a more diverse student body for serving the student and employer community.

The logical career fields to seek approval are in the career majors, Clinical and Administrative Medical Assisting (CAMA) for an AS Degree, Clinical Medical Assisting (CMA) as a certificate with option to continue for an AS Degree and Administrative Health Care Management (AHCM) as a certificate and AS Degree option. These programs provide the medical emphasis and SJVC experience in these career fields is extensive<sup>1</sup>.

The State of California has over 2 million people unemployed (11.1%) and the County of San Diego<sup>2</sup> has over 145,000 people unemployed (9.2%). The demographic of the area indicates a large pool of 18 to 24 age community  $(126,000)^3$  who do not have AS Degrees and a large group of unemployed seeking career opportunity.

# • SAN DIEGO GEOGRAPHIC AREA REVIEW

## **Labor Market Potential**

As of January 1, 2010, The US Census American Community Survey reported that San Diego County had a population of  $3,022,468^4$ . In December 2011, The Employment Development Department reported an unemployment rate of 9.2% for San Diego County. The largest city in this county is San Diego, which also has with an unemployment rate of 9.2%. The  $2^{nd}$  largest city is Chula Vista. Chula Vista has a current unemployment rate of 10.7%. Over 145,500 people are currently out of work in the County of San Diego. The following table illustrates the population numbers for the labor force by the county and the two largest cities in the region.<sup>5</sup>

## **Population Available for Post High School Education**

The US Census reports that over 130,000 of the population of the Cities of San Diego and Chula Vista are in the age range of 18 to 24 years old and do not have an AS Degree.<sup>6</sup> This age range is the age range of the majority of SJVC students. ## **Education Programs – Medical Assisting**

#### Labor Market and Employment Potential – Medical Assisting

The Employment Development Department predicts a total of 245 new job openings for Medical Assistants.<sup>10</sup> The following table includes salary information and total jobs predicted for the county of San Diego. There are 3,000 medical offices located in this County with over 2600 medical practices located in the San Diego/Chula Vista area.

## <u>Placement and Graduation Reference Information – Clinical Medical</u> <u>Assisting (Certificate) SJVC Rancho Cucamonga</u>

The SJVC Rancho Cucamonga Campus is the closest SJVC campus with graduates from the CMA Certificate option. The campus has been successfully training students in their Clinical Medical Assisting (CMA) program offering for over eight years. Placement rate for the certificate option in CMA averaged 80.1% for those eligible for placement<sup>13</sup> in the past six years from July 1, 2005 to June 30, 2011.<sup>14</sup> Over 230 students have successfully completed the certificate program in CMA training.

## <u>Placement and Graduation Reference Information – Clinical Administrative</u> and Medical Assisting (Associate Degree) SJVC Bakersfield

The SJVC Bakersfield Campus is the closest campus that offers the Clinical and Administrative Medical Assisting Associate Degree program. (The Rancho Cucamonga Campus offers the AS Degree program now, but did not have degree graduates in the time range from 2005 to 2011.) From July 1, 2005 to June 30, 2011 the Bakersfield Campus reports over 370 AS Degree graduates in the CAMA program. Of these graduates, 342 were eligible for placement.<sup>15</sup> All of the graduates from the CAMA program have completed the full requirements to earn the Associate of Science Degree. The placement percentage for these graduates is 82.1%.<sup>16</sup>

#### <u>Placement and Graduation Reference Information – Administrative Health</u> <u>Care Management Certificate and AS Degree – SJVC Rancho Cucamonga</u>

The Rancho Cucamonga campus is the closest existing campus with graduates from the AHCM program. The campus has been successfully training students in administrative office skills for over 8 years. Placement rates for this program averaged 75.8% for those eligible for placement<sup>20</sup> in the past six years of July 1, 2005 to June 30, 2011.<sup>21</sup> In this six year range, 138 students have successfully completed the training.<sup>22</sup>
