



Conflict of Interest Statement for Board Governors

Every member of the San Joaquin Valley College (SJVC) Board of Governors is required to disclose any actual or possible conflicts of interest, the existence of his or her financial interest, and any outside alliance or professional or personal involvement that might conflict with responsibilities to the College.

If the Board has reasonable cause to believe that a member has failed to disclose actual or possible conflicts of interest, it will provide the member an opportunity to explain the situation. If, after hearing the response of the member and making such further investigation as appropriate, the Board determines that the member has failed to disclose an actual or possible conflict of interest, the member is subject to termination from the Board.

San Joaquin Valley College Board of Governors' Conflict of Interest Policy: Signed Statement

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
